Job Summary:

Responsible for all maintenance, repair and servicing of all fire vehicles and equipment.

Principal Accountabilities:

- Responsible for all maintenance, repair and servicing of all assigned fire vehicles and equipment to include structural Aircraft Rescue Fire Fighting (ARF) and ambulance apparatus.
- Maintains all equipment and vehicle records to include but not limited to various small engines and breathing apparatus recharging systems.
- Establishes/maintains effective working relationships with other employees assigned to assist with any and all repair work.
- Maintains gasoline and diesel engines to include drive trains, running gear components, pumps, pump valves piping and high and low pressure air system.
- Repairs, rebuilds, maintains and overhauls engines, mechanical, electrical and hydraulic assemblies used in the Fire Department.
- Evaluates the scope of work to be performed and determines whether to repair, rebuild or replace various parts or assemblies.
- Plans and schedules all aspects of a major repair or maintenance project.
- Diagnoses electrical or mechanical malfunctions by utilizing electronic test equipment.
- Diagnose and repairs problems on fire pumps.
- Maintains complete and accurate records of all apparatus and equipment, showing in detail all work done to the particular vehicle or piece of equipment.
- Demonstrates knowledge of the Fire Department's budget process and its impact on the department's operation for all work assignments.
- Plans, assigns, coordinates, prioritizes, and follows through with activities necessary to support the mission of the Fire Department.
