JOB SUMMARY:

This position primarily reports to the Morris Fire Chief; however, is a partnership position in a Bureau of Fleet Apparatus Maintenance between three fire protection districts. The EVT will take direction from the cooperation of the three chiefs of the fire protection districts; however, will report directly to the fire chief of the effected fleet, or his designee. The position is primarily employed by Morris Fire & Ambulance District and will report to the Morris Fire Chief in matters of employment, benefits, etc. A wide range of responsibilities include, but are not limited to, performing routine maintenance of vehicles and equipment and the maintenance of vehicle repair and inventory records. The position will also assist with the fire district's fleet budget at the request of the various districts Fire Chief.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS INCLUDING, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

The position performs general maintenance and repair on light, medium and heavy-duty emergency response vehicles. This involves regular repair and service of vehicle components such as engine, electrical, transmission, brakes, suspension, steering and other components as required. The successful candidate will work independently and be subject to call-outs on a 24-hour basis. A working understanding of automotive and truck equipment and facility repair is required. The position may also provide fleet support at emergency situations as well as other duties as assigned. All functions of this position must perform work in accordance with the fire district's and other normally accepted safety policies and procedures.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- High school diploma or equivalent.
- Experience with hand and power tools.
- Valid Illinois class-B non-CDL license and Social Security Card.
- Full-time experience in vehicle repair and preventative maintenance during the immediate past 3 years.
- Demonstrated professionalism, multi-tasking abilities, consistent attendance and dedicated customer service.
- Knowledge of occupational hazards involved and safety precautions necessary in emergency vehicle repair work.
- Ability to repair vehicles and equipment under the direction of others as necessary.
- Current EVT certifications
- Current ASE certifications
- Demonstrated experience in developing specifications for emergency fleet apparatus including ladder trucks, squads, fire engines, ambulances and automobiles.
